The prayer room is a place...

• to hear from God and respond.

- 4 There are many different ways to hear from God and respond in His presence. Here are some: pray, read and meditate on God's Word, walk around, kneel, lay down, worship, draw, create, dance, write out prayers, journal, cry, repent, etc.
- Keep Jesus as the focus
- Sometimes the worship team may break out into spontaneous singing. Please do not be offended by this, but keep the focus of prayer and just agree in the Spirit of prayer by singing your own song of praise in your heart.

• for individual and/or corporate prayer and meditation on the Word.

- The Prayer room serves as a place for communion with God. Prayer includes: Praise & Thanksgiving, Repentance, Supplication & Petition, Intercession & Meditation on God's Word. We have a passage of Scripture that is our focus. You are encouraged to meditate on this passage during our worship time.
- Pray or sing at a volume consistent with others in the room and the volume of the music playing at that time.

• where the presence of the Lord rests.

- Please be respectful of others in the room.
 - Remember this worship night is a shared Christian community resource in which a variety of church backgrounds and expressions of prayer and worship are represented. Be understanding and considerate.
 - Please keep conversations outside of the prayer room.
 - We hope you brought your children with you. They are welcome here! We ask that as much as possible you encourage your children to engage with what is happening in the room but also to be quiet and respectful of others. This venue is a borrowed space. All children must remain under their parent's supervision.
 - Please keep the room clean and in order as it was when you arrived.
